<u>Description:</u> An introductory course in formal Arabic conversation. Students learn vocabulary and basic phrases used in everyday situations, building a foundation to be able to hold a basic conversation in correct, formal Arabic by the end of the course. Basic applications of Arabic grammar (nahu) and morphology (<u>s</u> arf) are also introduced, including:

- -idenitfying different types of sentences (al-jumal alismiyyah and al jumal al fi^liyyah)
- -identifying the grammatical components of a sentence and applying the appropriate diatrical marks (h arak a t) to them
- -identifying different types of h ur u f and how they are applied (h ur u f al-jarr, h ur u f an-na s b, h ur u f al-jazm)
- -identifying the Arabic pronouns and conjugating the surrounding words in a sentence appropriately.

Course Prerequisites:

- -Reading: students must be able to read and write basic Arabic words with ease.
- - \underline{S} arf: students must be proficient in the 14 Arabic pronouns and be able to conjugate verbs correctly in the past tense (al-m \underline{adi}) and in the present/future tense (al-mu \underline{da} ri^).
- *Students must pass a reading & sarf entry exam

<u>Description</u>: students learn the Arabic letters in their varying states of connection, developing the skill to read short words and progressing to reading short passages by the end of the course. The course covers:

- -proper pronunciation of the letters from their exits
- -applying the <u>h</u> arak <u>a</u> t, madd letters, tanw <u>i</u> n, and shaddah rules when reading
- -applying the rules of sun & moon letters (al <u>h</u> ur <u>uf</u> ash-shamsiyyah wal <u>a</u> amariyyah)
- -applying the rules of hamzah
- -joining words correctly within a sentence
- -applying the rules of stopping

Course prerequisites:

- -Reading requirements: students must be fluent in the Arabic letters, being able to identify the 28 letters proficiently.
- *Students must pass a reading entry exam

<u>Description</u>: An introductory course in \underline{S} arf, an essential knowledge for understanding the language of the \underline{Q} ur' \underline{a} \underline{n} and the \underline{h} ad \underline{i} th. Students learn how to conjugate words in Arabic in order to express themselves with precision. This course covers:

- -the 14 Arabic pronouns
- -conjugating verbs in the past, present/future, and command forms
- -conjugating verbs in the affirmative and negative
- -differentiating between singular/dual/and plural tenses for masculine and feminine subjects
- -applying the different plural forms

Course prerequisites:

- Reading requirements: students must be able to read and write short Arabic words with ease.
- *Students must pass a reading & writing entry exam

<u>Description</u>: Students learn the scripting of the Arabic alphabet in its single and combined forms, and progress to writing short words. By the end of the course, students are able to listen to short Arabic passages and transcribe them with precision. Students learn how to apply the rules pertaining to:

- \cup in the beginning of the word, how other letters connect to them, and how to identify them when they are joined with sun/moon letters.
 - 1 in its different forms, and when it is pronounced or not pronounced
 - al-Asm<u>a</u>' al-maw<u>su</u>lah
 - Joined pronouns
 - ت in its different forms and variations
 - Eliminating letters from words when it is required grammatically
 - Hamzah in its different forms and placements

Students who take this course progress to the next level of dictation, where they focus on applying these principles to the written word with more precision and speed.

 - -pilgrimage
 - -an overview of religious dealings
- -obligations and sins

Course prerequisites:

- -Reading requirements: students must be able to read short Arabic words with ease.
- *Students must pass a reading entry exam

^{*}The main objective of this course is for the students to memorize the text of the summary, until the end of the chapter of pilgrimage.

The basic rules of $Tajw \underline{i} d$ are also introduced, including the proper application of:

- -Mud u d (extensions)
- -Stopping within a verse and stopping at its end

<u>Description:</u> An intermediate course in formal Arabic expression, students refine their language skills and express their thoughts and ideas on an array of topics, including:

- -family dynamics
 - -daily life and occurrences
 - -student life and experiences
 - -correspondence
 - -depictions of people, places, seasons, natural environments, events, and personal experiences
 - -feelings and emotions

Students in this course learn to overcome the linguistic hurdles that non-native Arabic speakers typically face, choosing apt terminology to express themselves clearly, accurately, and easily. Based heavily on reading comprehension, self-expression, and dialogue, this course requires students to articulate their thoughts and ideas daily in Arabic. Through teacher-led discussions and group activities, students apply the linguistic fundamentals they are learning day by day in their full-time program of study, gaining the conversational fluency needed to interact meaningfully with native Arabic speakers, and paving the way for in-depth study of classical Arabic literature.

<u>Description</u>: In this course, students strengthen their Arabic reading skills—further refining their fluency, speed, and accuracy. Students begin by reading short Arabic literary passages and progress to reading religious texts by the end of the course. A strong emphasis is placed on reading comprehension and verbal expression of the main ideas presented in the selected literature. An essential for students who will continue their learning path in Arabic or Islamic studies, this course equips students to read and understand large passages of Arabic text with ease.

Course prerequisites: ALIPH Qira'ah 101

- -Reading: students must be able to read individual Arabic sentences with ease.
- *Students must pass a reading entry exam

- -al-m <u>i</u> z <u>a</u> n a <u>s</u> <u>s</u> arfiyy (morphological meters and scales)
- -analysis of verbs: their roots, origins, meters, modifications, and types
- -identification, classification, and conjugation of verbs in:
- -al-mujarrad & al-maz i d
- -al-l <u>a</u> zim & al-muta^add <u>i</u>
- -al mu^tall & a <u>s</u> <u>s</u> a <u>hih</u>
- -ism al-f a ^il & Iism al-maf^ u l

Students learn to use these foundational skills in $\underline{s}arf$ to improve their speech and to gain a deeper understanding of the religious texts. In this course, selected verses from the $\underline{Q}ur'\underline{a}n$ and prophetic $\underline{h}ad\underline{i}ths$ are examined, drawing upon the knowledge of $\underline{s}arf$ to understand their meanings.

Course prerequisites: ALIPH Sarf 101 OR:

- -Reading: students must be able to read and write Arabic sentences with ease.

<u>Description</u>: This course covers the explanation of *al-Ajurrumiyyah*, the famous text in Arabic grammar, widely embraced among the scholars as a basis for students seeking to become proficient in the Arabic language. Students in this course advance their formal Arabic speech by identifying word types and their roles within a sentence and applying their correct endings for accuracy and fluency. Additionally, they learn to:

- -identify and categorize parts of speech within a sentence
- -apply the rules of inflection (i^rab) -grammatical changes to the endings of words
- -apply the rules of verbs in the past, present/future, and imperative tenses as related to varying subjects
- -define and apply the basic rules of raf^, na s b, khaf d, and jazm
- -identify nominal subjects and predicates (al-mubtada' & al-khabar), and their roles within a sentence
- -identify al-marf $\underline{u} \wedge \underline{a} t$ and apply their rules
- -identify *al-man su bat* and apply their rules
- -identify al-majr u r a t and apply their rules.
- -identify and apply the rules of al-bin a'

Students who have established a solid base in al- \underline{A} jurrumiyyah are prepared to pursue higher-level Arabic subjects in na \underline{h} u, bal \underline{a} ghah (eloquence), and adab (literature). Additionally, they gain a deeper understanding of the \underline{Q} ur' \underline{a} n and prophetic \underline{h} ad \underline{i} ths, and are equipped to pursue the Islamic areas of knowledge which are taught purely in Arabic.

*Students in this course memorize the text of al- \underline{A} jurr \underline{u} miyyah.

Course prerequisites:

Reading & Writing: Students must be able to read and compose short Arabic passages with ease.

Authored as an explanation of the <u>Mukhta s</u> ar of ^Abdull <u>a</u> h al Harariyy, this book breaks down the text and elucidates its meanings, phrase by phrase. Students in this course focus on memorizing and become fluent in expressing:

- -The essentials of the creed of Ahlussannah wal-Jam a ^ah
- -The meanings of the two Islamic testifications of faith
- -The attributes of Allah and the attributes of the prophets
- -Blasphemy and its judgments
- -Obligations of the heart
- -Sins of the Body
- -Repentance

Students who have established a solid foundation in the book of al- \underline{Q} awl al Jaliyy are equipped to study more advanced books in Islamic creed, including $Bughyatu \underline{t}$ - \underline{Ta} lib, $A \underline{s}$ - \underline{S} ir \underline{at} al-Musta \underline{at} m, and $A \underline{t}$ - \underline{Ta} \underline{ha} \underline{wiyyah} .

*Students in this course memorize the text of the *Mukhta s ar*: Introduction, Essentials of Belief and Rules of Apostasy, Oblgations and Sins, and Repentance.

Authored as an explanation of the <u>Mukhta s ar</u> of <u>Abdull a h al-Harariyy</u>, this book breaks down the text and elucidates its meanings, phrase by phrase. Students in this course focus on memorizing and becoming fluent in expressing the basic Figh judgments according to the school of Imam ash-Shafi^iyy, using the precise terminology adopted by the Islamic scholars to relay judgments pertaining to:

- -purification & prayer
- -zak<u>a</u>h
- -fasting
- -pilgrimage
- -transactions, marriage, and dealings

Students in this course gain the necessary foundation to apply the $fi \underline{a} h$ judgments in their daily lives, and are equipped to study more advanced books, including $Bughyatut - \underline{Ta} lib$, al - Ghazziyy's explanation of the text of $Ab \underline{i} Shuj \underline{a} ^ n$, and $Tu \underline{h} fatu \underline{t} - \underline{Ta} lib$. Students in this course memorize the text of $al - Mukhta \underline{s} ar$: the introduction and the chapters of purification and prayer, $zak\underline{a}h$, fasting, pilgrimage, transactions, marriage, and dealings.

<u>Course Prerequisites:</u> ALIPH Mukhta <u>s</u> ar 101 OR:

- -Students must be able to read, write, and understand the text of the *Mukhtasar*: the Introduction and the chapter of purification and prayer.

<u>Description:</u> After having established the foundation needed to aptly express themselves in Arabic, students in this course learn the art of eloquent articulation. Delving into advanced-level literary passages, students widen their vocabulary base and gain exposure to poignant Arabic expressions pertaining to:

- -Artful descriptions of the natural world, notable people, and memorable experiences
- -Sentimentality and reminiscence
- -Inspirational narratives
- -Islamic literature

Students are further enriched by memorizing and analyzing selected literature of the classical Arabic masters from the pre-Islamic, Islamic, Umayyad, and Abbasid Eras, and are introduced to the literary sciences of al-bayan, al badi^, and al-ma^ani, drawing upon them to strengthen, sharpen, and beautify their own rhetoric.

Students who finish this course are prepared to more fully understand the highest eloquence found in the verses of the Qur'an, and to gain a deeper knowledge of the profound meanings of the prophetic hadiths.

Course Prerequisites: ALIPH Ta^bir 201 OR:

- -Students must be able to write and express themselves with ease in formal Arabic about a wide range of topics, while applying the rules of nahu and sarf within their speech.
- *Students must pass a reading/writing entry exam.

<u>Description:</u> After having established a strong base in al-Ajirrumiyyah, students in this course delve further into the essential chapters of nahu, studying the the famed linguist al-Hattab al- Malikiyy's al-Fawakih al-Janiyyah. Students learn more detailed rules and applications pertaining to:

- -I^rab: linguistic inflection (raf^, nasb, khafd, jazm) of words within a sentence to reflect the intended meaning.
- -Identifying the grammatical components of a sentence, their linguistic impact, and the meanings they convey.
- -Proper categorization of words and sentence components
- -Identifying irregular nouns and verbs and applying their rules of i^rab.
- -Identifying the morphological origin and structure of words, rationalizing their variations, and selecting them appropriately to communicate the intended meaning.

By the end of the course, students are skilled at applying Arabic linguistic principles to their own speech and writing with speed and accuracy, and are prepared to understand Arabic literature at a deeper level. Additionally, students are equipped to take higher-level religion courses in creed and jurisprudence, such as the explanations of as-Sirat al-Mustaqim and Matn Abi Shuja^, in their original Arabic publications.

*Students in this course memorize the text of al-Fawakih al-Janiyyah

Course prerequisites: ALIPH Nahu 201 and SARF 201 OR:

- -Reading & Writing: Students must be able to read, write, and understand Arabic proficiently.
- -Nahu: Students must have taken al-Ajirrumiyyah thoroughly
- -Sarf: Students must have taken the explanation of al-^lzziyy thoroughly
- *Students must pass a Nahu and Sarf entry exam.

- -The essentials of the creed of Ahlussannah wal-Jama^h and the meanings of the two Islamic testifications of faith
- -The attributes of Allah and the attributes of the prophets
- -Blasphemy and its judgments
- -Purification & prayer
- -Zakah, fasting, pilgrimage
- -Transactions, marriage, and dealings
- -Obligations of the heart and sins of the body
- -Repentance

<u>Course Prerequisites:</u> _ ALIPH Al Qawl Al Jaliyy 201-Creed & Figh 201 OR:
